\_\_\_\_\_

Since "\_\_\_\_\_" and "\_\_\_\_\_" can refer to different people, we can specify who/what is receiving the object(s). To do this, simply add "\_\_\_\_\_ + \_\_\_\_\_/\_\_\_\_\_/\_\_\_\_\_" either at the beginning of the sentence **or** after the direct object.

## Los pronombres indirectos

Direct object pronouns describe who or what receives the action in a sentence. The **IN**direct object pronouns, however, tell **to** whom/what or **for** whom/what an object is given. The indirect object pronouns in Spanish are:

me nos

te os

le les

Just like DOP's, IOP's can be placed **before** a **conjugated** verb or **attached** to an **infinitive** verb. They can also be **attached** to a **present participle** if an accent is added correctly.

## ¡A practicar!

1. I give the gifts to you. Yo te doy los regalos.
2. You give the ties to him. Tú le das las corbatas.
3. My dad seems happy to us. Mi padre nos parece feliz/alegre/contento.
4. We give the t-shirts to our parents. Nosotros les damos las camisetas.
5. Y'all give the sweater to me. Vosotros me dais el suéter.
6. The women seem nice to y'all. Las mujeres os parecen simpáticas.

Since “le” and “les” can refer to different people, we can specify who/what is receiving the object(s). To do this, simply add “a/para + name/noun/pronoun” either at the beginning of the sentence **or** after the direct object.

- You give the ties to him. Tú le das las corbatas a él.  
A él le das las corbatas.
- We give the t-shirts to our parents. Les damos las camisetas a nuestros padres.  
A nuestros padres les damos las camisetas.

Here are some new sentences with some new verbs...

1. We buy socks for our friends. Nosotros les compramos los calcetines.
2. My mom seems angry to me. Mi madre me parece enojada.
3. You don't seem excited to us. Tú no nos pareces emocionado.
4. They are writing her letters. Ellos le están escribiendo cartas.  
Ellos están escribiéndole cartas.
5. I don't want to buy y'all a suit. Yo no os quiero comprar un traje.  
Yo no quiero compraros un traje.
6. You all need to listen to me. Ustedes me necesitan escuchar.  
Ustedes necesitan escucharme.
