El verbo “gustar”

-To say that you like something in Spanish, use the verb **gustar**. However, the literal translation of **gustar** is “**to be pleasing**”, **NOT** “to like”.

MODELO:

How we would say it: **I like pizza.**

How it literally translates: **Pizza is pleasing to me.**

-When using the verb “gustar”, only two conjugation forms are used- “**gusta**” and “**gustan**”.

-An **indirect object pronoun** will come before “gustar” to tell who likes something.

Te gusta	Os gusta	Te gustan	Os gustan
Le gusta	Les gusta	Le gustan	Les gustan

Ejemplo: You like the book.

A ti te gusta el libro.

A nosotros nos gusta caminar.

-To make a sentence negative, place **no immediately** before the IOP.

Ejemplo: You don't like the book.

A ti **no** te gusta el libro.

¡Inténtalo! We don't like to walk.

A nosotros no nos gusta caminar.

I don't like the pens.

A mí no me gustan las plumas.
