

Pronouns after Prepositions

Preposition: a word used to show a relationship between a noun or pronoun and another word in the sentence.

Ejemplos: _____

Object of the preposition: the noun or pronoun that follows the preposition.

Prepositional Pronouns	

*Note that objects of the preposition can also be names

-When *mí* and *ti* are used after the preposition *con*, the words are combined.

con + mí = _____ con + ti = _____

-The preposition *entre* is followed by *yo* and *tú* instead of *mí* and *ti*.

Ejemplo: The table is between you and Elena. _____

Pronouns after Prepositions

Ejemplos: para con entre

Object of the preposition: the noun or pronoun that follows the preposition.

Prepositional Pronouns	
mí	nosotros/as
ti	vosotros/as
él/ella/Ud.	ellos/ellas/Uds.

*Note that objects of the preposition can also be names

-When *mí* and *ti* are used after the preposition *con*, the words are combined.

con + mí = **conmigo (no accent)**

con + ti = **contigo**

-The preposition *entre* is followed by *yo* and *tú* instead of *mí* and *ti*.

Ejemplo: The table is between you and Elena.

La mesa está entre tú y Elena.
