Course Description: Spanish 1 is an introduction to basic vocabulary and grammar used in Spanish speaking countries. The purpose is to provide students with a strong foundational understanding of the language through speaking, reading, writing, listening, and culture. All assignments will work to improve the students' overall communicative skills in the target language.

Class Expectations:

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Grades: The Spanish Department has designated the following system for grading. Any form of academic dishonesty will result in a zero (see bottom of page 2).

Assessments: 60%

The assessment category includes quizzes, tests, speaking assessments, and some projects. Assessments are always announced ahead of time so that students can adequately prepare. If a student knows that s/he will be absent on the day of an assessment, it is the student's responsibility to schedule a make-up time with Ms. Dixon. **No retakes will be offered*

Performance: 40%

The performance category includes classwork, homework, participation, and some projects. Homework is assigned often and must be completed before entering the classroom. Most homework is graded on a credit/no credit basis. If the homework is complete, full credit is given. If the assignment is not complete or is missing, students will receive a zero. No late work is accepted as the assignment is reviewed in class on the day that it is due. No make-up work will be given to a student with an unexcused absence, nor will homework be accepted from a student with an unexcused tardy. Due to the nature of this course, students' active participation in all activities is expected and required. Students must attend class and participate actively every day.

*Statement of Academic Honesty

Plagiarism is considered:

- 1. Copying homework from another student or allowing someone else to do so.
- 2. Utilizing an electronic or on-line translator to put one's words into the target language. Translators are only acceptable when used as a dictionary for a *single* word.
- 3. Using someone else's ideas in a paper without giving that person credit.

Other forms of dishonest behavior are:

- 1. Looking at another student's paper during a test or quiz or allowing someone to do so.
- 2. Giving/receiving answers during a test.
- 3. Telling a student who has not yet taken a test or quiz what questions are asked on the test.
- 4. Using a native speaker or another person in a nonreciprocal manner. It is appropriate to ask for coaching assistance. However, during this process you are responsible for providing your own answers in order to strengthen your understanding of material.

Tardy Policy: Students are expected to be in class and seated by the designated start time for class. Students who arrive after this time will be marked as tardy.

Absence Policy: Ms. Dixon's absence policy is the same as the policy found in the NIS Student Handbook. If a student has an excused absence, s/he needs to check the absent work folder on the day of return to class to find out what was missed. Any assignments will have the student's name on them in the absent folder. Students need to ask a classmate for any notes that may have been missed or they can be found on Ms. Dixon's website. In order to receive full credit, a student must turn in missed assignments after the same amount of days that s/he had an excused absence (i.e. if 3 days were missed, 3 days are given to turn in missed work).
